

Can You Retire on 100 Dollars a Day?

One of the mantras you commonly hear regarding retirement planning is, "Save all that you can." However, even when you save as much as possible, you might find that your budget in retirement just isn't adequate to cover all of your expenses. That's when you begin looking for ways to reduce your expenses, to make up for the shortfall in your budget.

The good news is, there are places with a lower cost of living, where it is possible to live on less than 100 dollars per day. According to a recent analysis of data from the Census Bureau and Bureau of Labor Statistics, the following ten places are considered ideal spots for retirees who seek a lower cost of living:

- Aurora, Colorado
- · Cleveland, Ohio
- Dallas, Texas
- Durham, North Carolina
- Jacksonville, Florida
- Kansas City, Kansas
- Madison, Wisconsin
- Minneapolis, Minnesota
- Phoenix, Arizona
- Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania

This analysis was performed using data in five categories: housing, food, transportation, health care, and utilities. Naturally, your own personal expenses will also factor into the equation. For example, if you are particularly dedicated to a certain hobby or outdoor activity, the cost of pursuing your dreams will vary depending upon location. Entertainment is another variable that you should consider.

As you can see, all of the areas listed are major cities. In most cases, the cost of living in smaller towns tends to be lower, although that rule does not always hold true.

Another important factor to consider is proximity to family. Early in retirement, you might choose a location based upon your personal interests or a low cost of living. But as you age, you might find yourself wishing to be closer to your children and grandchildren. Travel might become more difficult if you develop health problems, and you might require additional hired help completing tasks that family members might otherwise have adopted.

The takeaway lesson here is that yes, there are places where retirees can expect to live on less than 100 dollars per day. But as with all things concerning retirement planning, your decision about where to live will depend on a variety of personal factors, not just raw data.

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Tumpkin Cake with Cinnamon Cream Cheese Frosting

Ingredients


- 1 cup whole wheat flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1 (15oz) can pumpkin puree
- 4 eggs (always use eggs at room temperature)
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ginger
- 1/2 cup applesauce
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1-1/4 cups sugar

Cinnamon Cream Cheese Frosting

- 8 oz cream cheese at room temperature
- 1/2 cup butter at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups powdered sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon

Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350F. Spray a 9x13" baking pan with cooking spray.
- 2. In a medium bowl, sift together the flours, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, ginger and cloves. Set aside.
- In another bowl, mix together the pumpkin, applesauce, vegetable oil, sugar and eggs. Add in the dry ingredients and mix just until combined. Do not overmix.
- 4. Pour the batter into pan and bake 25-30 minutes.
- 5. Frosting: Cream together the cream cheese and butter until smooth, about 3 minutes. Add in the powdered sugar slowly, mixing until completely incorporated. Mix in the vanilla and cinnamon.
- 6. Frost the cooled cake with the Cinnamon Cream Cheese Frosting.


